Chaplain's Message: Fr. Jeremy

The gospel today is from Matthew: Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you not 7 times but 77 times." And he goes on to give a parable about the merciful king. When I read this, I thought about how often I've thought that Jesus was sort of correcting or reprimanding Peter. But today, the words that caught me were that Peter approached Jesus. Essentially, Peter is coming to Jesus and authentically asking "what must I do? I've forgiven my brother 7 times, is that enough? That's all I can do or have in me." And then Jesus says "no, not 7 times but 77 times." 77 times is possible because Peter has come to Jesus. There's this reality in the Catholic theology world that grace builds on nature, so we must do what we can naturally do first, and then God augments and amplifies that by His own grace and goodness. So when it comes to forgiveness, which is a hard thing to do (we've all been wronged or have experienced people who have had hardships and hurts from), we are all called to forgive to the best of our abilities naturally. Then, as we approach Jesus, as Peter did, we allow His grace to then to start to work through us, to take us to the next step and beyond what we are capable of doing. 77 times is intended to be perfect forgiveness, a perfect action that is beyond us. For us, it is indeed beyond us. But as Peter approaches Jesus, it becomes possible. Peter had done what he can do and Jesus takes it from there. If there's someone in your life that you struggle to forgive, do what you can do to forgive him or her, and then take it to Jesus. Ask Jesus to help you do the rest and take the next step, invite the grace in. God wants to help us. Forgiveness is one of the great signs of the Christian faith, the ability to forgive as Chris forgives, but it is done as we forgive with Christ helping us. I challenge you to be men of

forgiveness.
