Chaplain's Encouragement

The Christmas season is now quickly behind us. The "Twelve Days" seem finished before they start. The world incorrectly assuming December 25 as the

culmination not the beginning of those august days of the Word made Flesh. Closely associated with the Birth of Our Lord are two other feasts in the Church: The Feast of the Holy Family (December 30 in 2022) and the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God (January 1). Feasts that rightly remind us that Christ coming to earth was not as conquering solitary God but as humble family member. The Holiday season – or rightly remembered, Holy Days season – held such promise and potential. It always does. The opportunity to be



together with family, to give and receive, to recognize the unfathomable Gift of the Christ Child born into the loving – albeit impoverished – arms of Mary and Joseph. But our family time is meant to be incarnate in more than smiles, hugs, and wrapped gifts. It is meant to incarnate authentic love in real and tangible relationships of the Holy Family.

So, did it? Did your relationships get better? Did you experience the Incarnate love of Christ in the Holy Family and then re-present that incarnate love into your family, thereby making it more holy? Would your family say you loved them better, more intensely, more intentionally, more authentically after these last few days? Did they see Joseph in you?

Well, the experience of Christmas is meant to be lived in love the whole year through, including today. There is still time, still promise, still potential, latent there. As we move into January, we Knights are mindful of the true gift of life always latent within family, within women, within the birth of a child. As we approach the anniversary of Roe v Wade mindful of the Dobbs decision, we are also mindful of just how much need there is for a rediscovery of the sanctity of family, of women, of children, of life. Supreme Court decisions, won by careful jurisprudence, prayer, and grassroots legislation, will now need to be put into local reality in real families, real towns, real lives. Your families, that of your neighbors, your coworkers, all. The initial months since Dobbs have not fared

so well at the state level – reminding us all the more of the need to change hearts more than laws. My prayers for those who will be attending the March for Life. For while the immediate goal has shifted, the long term goal of full recognition of the sanctity of life & family from conception to natural death is still very much before us.

February can seem one of the longest months, even though the shortest 28 days. The winter cold and darkness partner together, toward dreariness. In the secular world, levity is sought with Valentine's Day. Yes, I know St Valentine is a fully Catholic saint, but as on display in the world, not so much. We Knights know that true joy and lightness of heart comes from true love rooted in real faithful, fruitful, free, and full relationship. Not that Valentine's Day is contrary to real relationship, but that is not what seems to get the attention. One's marriage (if one bothers with such practices anymore?!?) needs much more than to stoke a fire in the bedroom as to enkindle the Flames of the Spirit in the Heart. We are challenged to think beyond mere romance to a renewal of Marriage vows and the gift of Marriage itself. Marriage is written in our bodies, yet the fallenness of our minds, bodies, and souls leaves us grasping. For Marriage to be life-giving, it needs to become the supernatural relationship God designed it to be. Promises of fidelity in good times and bad, sickness and health, where love and honor are the foundation for all the days of one's life cannot be mere words... They must be incarnate in our lives of sacrifice, of humble service, of holy lives. They must witness the need, the truth, the gift of complementarity – male and female. And this all the more, as the world has once again taken strange detours. The so-called "Defense of Marriage" law passed in December does nothing to uphold such real, true, incarnate marriages. And like Roe and Dobbs and other legislation of our days, this too will be the confrontation before us as Catholic Christian Men, as Knights. It seems Christmas and the Holy Family and Mary the Mother of God reach much further than first imagined. They reach into every day. Each and every day where we strive to live and love

as God created us – male and female born each into our families, so as to be formed and accepted into the Holy Family of God.
