Chaplain's Encouragement

On the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception this past December, Holy Father, Pope Francis declared a “**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH**” to run until December 08, 2021. In a particular way, Pope Francis sees a need to for renewed intercession and study of St Joseph’s life of faith and discipleship as an example for us today. Pope Francis’ reflection on St Joseph called *Patris Corde – With a Father’s Heart* is well worth the read (search online for “Patris Corde”). Pope Francis organizes his reflection on St Joseph, the first and greatest of the saints after the Blessed Virgin Mary, his spouse around seven aspects of the life, love, and labor of Joseph’s ministry and discipleship to Jesus.

A beloved father

A tender and loving father

An obedient father

An accepting father

A creatively courageous father

A working father

A father in the shadows



Without a doubt, the calling of St Joseph was exceptional. He was tasked with accompanying, protecting, and providing for Jesus and Mary and oversee the Holy Family. After accepting Mary in marriage, his whole life was changed and transformed to center on her and her Divine Mission in the Son Jesus. And while Jesus was no orphan, Joseph did step in to care for Him as an adopted father. And while Mary was no widow, Joseph guarded and defended her, while not requesting nor requiring any of the natural benefits of a husband. In some ways, I see in St Joseph a natural example for us Knights of Columbus tasks with looking after widows and orphans and guiding our own holy families. Financial protection via insurance is one things (even Joseph provided for the worldly needs of Mary and Jesus by his earnings as a carpenter), but more importantly was St Joseph’s masculine presence in the Holy Family to lead with courage, righteous faith, and silent witness in the face of hardship and required self-sacrifice. He was a man’s man by sacrificing in love his own dreams and pursuits to fulfill the holy plan of God at work in Jesus and Mary. My how we can, could, and should learn from St Joseph. I pray as this “Year of St Joseph” progresses, you will turn to him in intercession and prayer, that you too may be a holy worker, holy husband, and holy father to those in your life and our communities.

Pope Francis ended *Patris Corde – With a Father’s Heart* with the following prayer:

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.*

*Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,

Who pays What?

Most Cardinal Ritter Council 1221 members are responsible for paying \$40.00 per year in dues. Exceptions below:

Honorary Membership Members who have attained the age of 65 years and who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years shall be designated as honorary members. Those members pay \$10.00 per year in dues.

Honorary life Membership Members who have attained the actual age of 70 years and who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years, and those who have been members of the Order for 50 consecutive years, regardless of age, shall be designated as honorary life members. Those members are exempt from Dues.

Priests and Religious Brothers who have taken their final or perpetual vows are automatically designated as Honorary life members upon participating in their first ceremonial. However, this status is not awarded to permanent deacons or seminarians unless they meet the requirements based on age and years of service.

Exempt Relief from Payment — Those brother Knights who are unable to engage in any occupation for a period of at least six months or who contact an officer due to special financial circumstances may apply for waiver of dues.

Withdrawal If a member withdraws from membership and is an insurance member, he will be recorded as an inactive member and will remain in that status on the council roster as long as his insurance is in force. The council continues to be responsible for Supreme and state council assessments on inactive members. However, a \$9 credit is applied to the council's account the month following the anniversary date of the member's insurance policy to offset such assessments.

Associate Member A member who is NOT enrolled in K of C Insurance.

Insurance Member A member who IS enrolled in K of C Insurance.

We as a council are responsible to pay both the Indiana State Council and the Supreme (National)

A motion was made, seconded and passed at the December members meeting to bring that fantastic room back to its previous grandeur. The idea has been tossed around for a number of years and gained momentum in November when a member approached your Grand Knight, Mike Carter with an idea you might say was scribbled on a napkin. Many great projects started with ideas jotted down on napkins and so with this one. The project was unanimously passed by the CBC Trustees at the December Business meeting. Preparations and cleanup began immediately. By the time you read this the third floor, which many didn't know existed has been cleared of the junk and empty boxes accumulated over the years. What a gem that has been hidden above the drop ceiling. The project will be completed in phases.

Phase One will include tearing out the drop ceiling, prep and paint underside of roof deck and metal trusses, install new LED lighting and what should any big room have besides a BIG ASS FAN. When this is completed everything will be cleaned and ready for Lenten Fish Frys. That's right all this needs to be done in a few short weeks beginning January 9th. Scaffolding will be delivered January 6th, dumpster brought in, Fish Fry January 8th, scaffold set up January 9th, power is cut and DEMOLITION BEGINS! Painting has been lined up, Big ASS fan is ordered, lighting is in stock and the electrician is ready to go.

Phase Two – Tentative start date Mid April - will include prep and paint the third floor walls, sand and finish the balcony/track floor (may be done in phase one), bring the railing up to code and paint, install balcony lighting, improve and finish the steps to the balcony and open the area once again to public use.

A new insulated roof is also in the works. Other ideas are being discussed and may be implemented in the future. A Grand Gala will take place in September to celebrate.

Please read this letter to your council at your next business meeting.

The Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles has approved our Indiana Knights of Columbus Charity Fund Inc. Special Group Recognition License Plate application!



Everyone will be able to order the Indiana Knights of Columbus plate for their car, light truck, RV, or motorcycle starting on January 1, 2020. This plate can be ordered through IN.gov/BMV, at BMV branches, at BMV Connect kiosks, or BMV partial service providers. The plates will cost \$30 in addition to applicable taxes and registration fees. A \$15 supplemental fee and a \$15 group fee is due for each Knights of Columbus plate that is purchased. This plate may be personalized for an additional \$45. The BMV will return the \$15 group fee for each license plate sold to the IN K of C Charity Fund Inc.

The IN K of C Charity Fund Inc is our 501(c)(3) established to help people in urgent need situations. This fund has provided grants for disaster relief, coats for kids, food for families, ultrasound machines, and other similar needs. A few years ago, the father of a Priest passed away. The Priest could not afford to bury his father, so a grant from the IN K of C Charity Fund Inc helped to pay those final expenses. Tax deductible donations can be sent directly to this fund. Make checks payable to "Indiana State Council Knights of Columbus Charity Fund, Inc" and mail them to the Fund Treasurer, PSD Bob Lynch (3215 St. Jude Dr., Indianapolis, IN 46227). Use Smile.Amazon.com when you shop and a portion of each purchase will also be contributed to this fund.





Rules of the Game

1. The Wheel of Cash game consists of the Wheel of Cash Board and a Wheel of Cash Bonus Board. The Wheel of Cash Board starts the first week with 72 available numbers, decreases by one number weekly increasing the odds of winning the Jackpot. The Bonus Board starts with 36 numbers and decreases by one number as winners progress to it.
2. Must be 18 years of age to purchase tickets.
3. Tickets sell for \$2.00 each, ONLY cash accepted.
4. When purchasing tickets the player must PRINT LEDGIBLY their First and Last name, phone number and One available number from each game board in the appropriate space on the back of the ticket. Only one name may be entered on a ticket.
5. A listing of available numbers will be updated and posted at the conclusion of each weekly drawing.
6. The Jackpot for the first weekly drawing starts at \$1000.00 on each board.
7. The Jackpot will increase weekly at the rate of 75% of the previous week's total sales minus any Cash prize awarded. The increase will be split equally between the two boards. Knights of Columbus 1221 Charitable Gaming Fund will retain the remaining 25%.
8. Winners will be required to furnish two forms of identification with one being a picture ID.
9. Winning over \$599.00 will require the winner to provide tax information and Knights of Columbus Council 1221 will send you a tax form W-2G for winnings over \$599.00. You the winner will owe Federal and State Tax on all winnings. Knights of Columbus Council 1221 will withhold 25% of winnings over \$5000.00 as required for federal taxes. A check for any Jackpot winning will be issued within 7 days after proper identification and all IRS paper work is completed.
10. Ways to win Wheel of Cash.
 - To win the entire Jackpot the winning ticket holder must be present at the time of the drawing.
 - If the winning ticket holder is not present they will be awarded ½ the Jackpot with the remainder going to the Knights of Columbus Council 1221 Charitable Gaming Fund.
 - If Jackpot is uncovered on the Wheel of Cash Board the winner will advance to the Wheel of Cash Bonus board.

 - Ticket sales will end at 7:15 pm sharp the night of the drawing.
 - Tickets will be rotated/mixed prior to the drawing.
 - An Operator will select One ticket from the drum and check for accuracy of required information. Questionable tickets will be validated by the Game Official
 - If more than One ticket is drawn or comes out of the drum they will be returned to the drum, mixed again and another ticket drawn.
 - If the drawn ticket does not have the players First and Last name, phone number and a current available number from the Wheel of Cash game board, the ticket will be deemed INVALID and another ticket drawn. If a ticket is deemed Invalid, no information from the ticket will be announced. Any INVALID ticket will be retained by the Game Official.
 - Ticket owner and number chosen will be announced ONLY after the ticket has been validated then entered on the Game Winners List.
 - The Operator will peel back the number entered on the back of the winning ticket from the Wheel of Cash Board revealing any award. If the winner proceeds to the Bonus Board, the appropriate number from the back of the winning ticket will be peeled back revealing any award.
 - After a verified winner has been established all remaining tickets in the drum will be destroyed.
