RRV Bonaventure M. Knaebel, OSB who is now 98 was born September 6, 1918 in New Albany, Indiana. He professed his monastic vows during the Great Depression in 1938, was ordained a priest at the height of World War II in 1943 and elected archabbot of Saint Meinrad in 1955. Archabbot Bonaventure's adventure of obedience started while growing up in New Albany. The archabbot showed an interest in the priesthood when he was in the seventh grade at the former Holy Trinity School in New Albany after a man from Parish had been ordained a priest. He explored that desire in part by serving at daily Mass at the parish at a Mass that started at 6 a.m. In response to this desire to be an altar server, his mother bought him an alarm clock.

When asked to give words of encouragement to men considering life as a Benedictine monk, Archabbot Bonaventure spoke about the purpose of his adventure of obedience—growing closer to God.

"I'm not sure that you would have any of the experiences that I've had, but it is a fulfilling life," Archabbot Bonaventure said. "It does help you to do what the Rule [of St. Benedict] says, to seek God."

Uncle Merton, as Bobby calls him, entered Council #1221 on October 1, 1970 and went on to become a 4th Degree member in Assembly #244. He has been an active Knight for 46 years now along with his nephew, Robert S. Knaebel who was born in New Albany in 1951 and became a Knight on October 18, 1970. Bobby is the main bartender at the council in the evenings donating his time and services. Bobby's son, Robert S. Knaebel II has been a member now for 24 years and his grandson, Noah P. Carlisle just entered the Knights January 12, 2017. He and his brother Nick have been helping at Fish Fry's for a number of years now.

Uncle Merton's brother and Bobby's dad, Robert L. Knaebel entered the Knights in 1956 and also became a 4th Degree. He was an active member for 28 years until he passed away in 1985.

Lift Up, Give Up, Take Up

Lent is the forty day period before Easter, excluding Sundays, which began on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday.

Fast and Abstinence

It is a traditional doctrine of Christian spirituality that a constituent part of repentance, of turning away from sin and back to God, includes some form of penance, without which the Christian is unlikely to remain on the narrow path and be saved (Jer. 18:11, 25:5; Ez. 18:30, 33:11-15; Joel 2:12; Mt. 3:2; Mt. 4:17; Acts 2:38). Christ Himself said that His disciples would fast once He had departed (Lk. 5:35). The general law of penance, therefore, is part of the law of God for man.

Easter Triduum

The greatest mysteries of the redemption are celebrated yearly by the Church beginning with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until Vespers of Easter Sunday.

Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining.


